2022-23 school year: Families must apply to receive free meals!

For the upcoming 2022-23 school year, students will no longer receive free meals unless they have been approved for the Free and Reduced Meals program. This is a change from this year (the 2021-22 school year) with free meals being offered to all PSD students. The program that helped make that possible (related to the pandemic) is ending. For the 2022-23 school year, families must apply and be approved for the Free and Reduced Meals program to receive benefits. Applications for the 2022-23 school year are now being accepted. News from our Health Office:

When returning to school from an illness - Any of the following symptoms which are not usual symptoms of a documented chronic condition[†] (regardless of vaccination status): fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea – require a **NEGATIVE Covid test** (home test is accepted) – EXCEPT for situations such as If you have had a household exposure to COVID-19 in the previous 10 days you should have a negative <u>lab</u> test (PCR or molecular) to rule out COVID-19 infection. At-home test results do not apply.

I want to let you know that School Resource Officer, Dexter Rowe, periodically visits classrooms for instructional purposes. Many of you have met him on our campus as he helps with Drop off and Pick Up and greets students throughout the day. He also teaches Internet safety, saying no to peer pressure, being safe at school, and other relevant topics.
